Simple Patterns to Ask Any Question with Confidence

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How to start?



Entering / greeting the mentor

Assalamualaikum, Sir. May I ask you something?
Good afternoon, Sir. Do you have a moment?

Hello, Sir. Sorry to disturb you.

Sir, may I take a minute of your time?



Asking permission to speak

Sir, may I ask you a question?

Sir, can I ask something quickly?

Sir, is it okay if I ask you something?

Sir, would you mind if I asked a question?

Sir, could I please ask you something?



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Asking for an explanation

Pattern: "Sir, could you please explain [topic]?"

Sir, could you please explain this word again?

Sir, could you please explain how to solve this problem?

Sir, could you please explain the meaning of this sentence?

Sir, could you please explain today's homework?

Sir, could you please explain this grammar rule again?



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Saying you have a question

Pattern: "Sir, I have a question about [topic]."

Sir, I have a question about the last lesson.

Sir, I have a question about this formula.

Sir, I have a question about the exam pattern.

Sir, I have a question about this paragraph.

Sir, I have a question about the assignment.



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Saying you don't understand

Pattern: "Sir, I don't understand [X]. Could you explain it again?"

Sir, I don't understand this sentence. Could you explain it again?

Sir, I don't understand this step. Could you explain it again?

Sir, I don't understand this diagram. Could you explain it again?

Sir, I don't understand this rule. Could you explain it again?

Sir, I don't understand this topic. Could you explain it again?



Asking if something is correct

Pattern: "Sir, is it correct to say [X]?"

Sir, is it correct to say "I am agree"?

Sir, is it correct to say the answer this way?

Sir, is it correct to say it like this in formal English?

Sir, is it correct to say this in the exam?

Sir, is it correct to say this sentence in past tense?



Asking what to do in a situation

Pattern: "Sir, what should I do if [situation]?"

Sir, what should I do if I forget the answer in the exam?

Sir, what should I do if I don't finish the homework on time?

Sir, what should I do if I get confused during the test?

Sir, what should I do if I miss a class?

Sir, what should I do if I don't understand a question?

Asking how to improve

Pattern: "Sir, how can I improve my [skill]?"

Sir, how can I improve my English speaking?

Sir, how can I improve my writing?

Sir, how can I improve my problem-solving speed?

Sir, how can I improve my grammar?

Sir, how can I improve my exam preparation?

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Ending the conversation politely

Thank you, Sir. That was very helpful.

Thank you so much, Sir. I understand now.

Sir, thank you for your time.

Okay, Sir. I understood. Thank you.

Thank you, Sir. I won't take more of your time.



Student-to-Student Conversation

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Asking for help

Pattern: "Hey, can you help me with [X]?"

Hey, can you help me with this question?

Hey, can you help me with my homework?

Hey, can you help me with this word?

Hey, can you help me with this problem?

Hey, can you help me with the notes?



Sharing your own doubt



Pattern: "I'm confused about [X]. Are you?"

I'm confused about this formula. Are you?

I'm confused about this sentence. Are you?

I'm confused about the homework. Are you?

I'm confused about this topic. Are you?

I'm confused about the exam pattern. Are you?





Asking to repeat something

Pattern: "Sorry, can you say that again?"

Sorry, can you say that again? I didn't catch it.

Sorry, can you say that again, a bit slower?

Sorry, can you say that again? I missed the last part.

Sorry, can you say that again? I wasn't listening properly.

Sorry, can you say that again? It was a bit unclear.





Some conversations can be tough to handle. So whenever you find yourself in those situations, believe in yourself. You can do this!
